

Ranking of applicants to Robert H. Goddard High School for Communication, Arts & Technology Visual Art & Design Program Q02A

- There are approximately 1100 applicants to Robert H. Goddard’s Visual Art & Design Program Q02A each year.
- This program’s admissions method is Educational Option (Ed. Opt.). On average, 140 students are admitted into Robert H. Goddard’s Visual Art & Design Program each year. In High School admissions, 50% of the offers are from students that meet our criteria (rank), and 50% of the offers are to the remaining applicants.
- The seat distribution below is the population of all Ed Opt schools in NYC: 16% are above grade level readers (in Goddard’s incoming Freshmen class typically = 22 students) 68% are on grade level readers (in Goddard’s incoming Freshmen class typically = 96 students) 16% are below grade level readers (in Goddard’s incoming Freshmen class typically = 22 students)
- Throughout the ranking and admissions process, Robert H. Goddard High School is not aware of any student’s high school preference list.
- Robert H. Goddard High School ranks applicants based on: attendance, punctuality, standardized New York State ELA/Math test scores, as well as an average of each student’s final June English, Math, Science, and Social studies course grades in 7th grade.
