Study Strategies

- Take a pretest. Figure out what you already know and focus on what you don't know. Fold the paper and test yourself. As you review the list, put a dot or check next to any items you don't know. At the end, you will know exactly which ones to focus on.
- Access Castle Learning to create your own pre-tests.
- Utilize Barron's Review Books to memorize vocabulary and to practice regents questions.
- Use colored index cards. Each topic can be written on a different colored card. If you only have white cards, put a colored dot on the corner.
- Study with a friend.
- Create your own study guide/Outline.
- Ask a parent to help you study.
- Use a textbook and read the information.
- Create a game out of the information
 - "Concentration" Review Game
- Describe or explain the information in your own words/Summarize.
- Explain the information to someone else/Accountable Talk.
- Write questions you think will be on the test and recite the answers.
- Make lists of the information.
- Draw a map, diagram or chart.
- Use information given in class to help you study (websites, worksheets).
- Create mnemonic devices to help you remember the information
